#### **GYA-Coordinator**

The Gulf Yachting Association was organized to promote the sport of yacht racing on the Gulf Coast in 1901. It initially consisted of 6 member clubs, but since reorganization in 1920, the GYA has grown to encompass over 30 member and affiliate clubs, ranging from Houston Yacht Club to the west, to Saint Petersburg Yacht Club to the east. Navy Yacht Club Pensacola has been a member of the GYA

since 1981.



The GYA serves many different purposes ranging from providing handicapping for racing boats throughout the Gulf Coast; providing Judges for club, regional and national regattas; sponsoring training for Race Officers and Race Committees and to maintaining the yacht racing schedule for the entire Gulf Coast. They also serve as the Organizing Authority for several of our major regattas, including the Lipton Challenge, the Junior Lipton Challenge, the WFORC, the GORC, the Ladie's GYA Championship and the GYA

Challenge Cup. They also coordinate the Capedeville series, which is the interclub, year long championship series. NYCP was very active in this series when sailed in Flying Scotts, but now the fleet has moved to Vipers, which is a more complex and expensive boat.

The GYA is also what generates reciprocity between member clubs, allowing us to visit and use the facilities of other member clubs located outside our immediate geographic area.

As you GYA Coordinator I am tasked with interfacing between the GYA and NYCP. I also plan on follow up articles to talk about yacht racing and how to use reciprocity when you travel. Take a look at the GYA website at GYA.org and feel to contact me if you have any questions.
