

**NOTICE OF RACE FOR 2009 NAVY CUP  
NAVY YACHT CLUB PENSACOLA  
MAY 30/31, 2009**

**1. Rules**

The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing including US Prescriptions, the 2009 Pensacola Bay Sailing Instructions, and this NOR.

**2. Classes**

2.1 The regatta will be open to the following classes: (1) PHRF Spinnaker; (2) PHRF Non-spinnaker; (3) Cruising (may use assigned PHRF ratings).

2.2. PHRF Spinnaker and PHRF Non-spinnaker entries must possess a valid and current PHRF certificate.

2.3. Cruising class will be limited to boats that normally race in this class.

**3. Eligibility and Entry**

3.1. This is a competition among yacht clubs. The regatta is open to all yacht clubs.

3.2. The skippers of all entered boats must be current members of the yacht clubs they represent.

3.3. Yacht clubs wishing to participate in this regatta must forward a check in the amount of \$250 to NYCP prior to 23 May 2009. This check should be made out to Navy Yacht Club Pensacola and mailed to: Dick Piatt, 4613 Northpointe Cir., Pensacola, FL 32514. Entry into the regatta enables a club to have as many participants as they wish.

3.4. An entry form for each individual boat must be completed during registration, or electronically from the NYCP web site ([navypnsyc.org](http://navypnsyc.org)). Please make sure electronic registrations are submitted prior to 9 pm, 29 May 2009. No on-the-water registrations will be accepted for this regatta.

**4. Schedule of events**

Saturday, 30 May

0830 – 1000 Registration at NAS Pensacola Bayou Grande Marina. Coffee and donuts will be available.

1000 Skippers' Meeting

1155 First Warning Signal

1600 (approx) After race party. Refreshments and regatta dogs at NYCP.

Sunday, 31 May

1155 First Warning Signal

1500 (approx) After race party and awards ceremony at NYCP.

**5. Races**

5.1. For Spinnaker and Non-spinnaker, three races are planned (two Saturday and one Sunday). For the Cruising class, two races are planned (one Saturday and one Sunday).

**6. Scoring**

6.1. The low point scoring system of Appendix A of the RRS will be used to determine the winner of each class.

6.2. A club's top three scoring boats in each class will be counted for Navy Cup points in accordance with the table below. i.e., if a club finished 1,2,3 in one of these classes, they would earn 54 points for that class.

<u>Class position</u>	<u>Points</u>
1	20
2	18
3	16
4	14

Beyond 4th, decrease by one point for each place

6.3. The club whose three classes have the most points wins the Navy Cup.

## **7. Awards**

There will be awards for the first three boats in each class. Additional class breaks may be made by the RC for awards purposes, depending on number of entries.
