More than two-thirds of all boating fatalities are drowning incidents and 90% of drowning victims were not wearing a life jacket. So buy a life jacket that you will wear ... it could save your life. Don't be caught dead without one.



What is an NYCP out of town member?

An out of town member is an individual or family who lives 150 miles away from Pensacola. The member must meet the qualifications of normal membership, ie retired military or DoD, active duty, or military student. The cost of an out of town membership is \$75.00 for family and \$50.00 for single. Plus \$30.00 one time admin fee for new members.

Out of town members receive a NYCP membership card which maybe used at yacht clubs near them. I ask new members to always check with the yacht club they are planning on attending to ensure they accept NYCP membership. Most GYA yacht clubs are welcoming.
